

Health declaration

The written health declaration shall be submitted in order to ensure a safe environment in schools and school establishments for the purpose of ensuring the safety and health protection of children and pupils pursuant to § 152(c) of Act No. 245/2008 Coll.c. on education and training, thus maintaining attendance and minimising the risk of disruption in the classroom.

Pursuant to Section 144 (7)(d) of Act No. 245/2008 Coll.c. I declare that: (mark "X")

- the child/student does not have any of the following symptoms:** excessive fatigue, head and body pain, increased body temperature, skin rash, signs of respiratory tract disease (runny nose, sore throat, loss of smell and taste, cough, difficulty breathing), signs of digestive tract disease (abdominal pain, vomiting, diarrhoea),
- the child/student has not been ordered to be quarantined** by the regional public health authority or by a general health care practitioner for children and adolescents,
- the child/student has not been in close contact¹ with a person positive for COVID-19,² within the last 7 days,**
- if the child/pupil has been abroad in the last 14 days:**
and is **less than 12 years of age:**
- have, together with persons living in the same household, fulfilled 14 days of self-isolation after entering the territory of the Slovak Republic, or have received a negative PCR test result after the 5th day of self-isolation, or is claiming the status of fully vaccinated persons³,
- and is **more than 12 years of age:**
- have fulfilled the obligation of self-isolation isolation for 14 days after entering the territory of the Slovak Republic, or have received a negative PCR test result after the 5th day of self-isolation, or is claiming the status of fully vaccinated persons.

I am aware that in the event of a change in health status and manifestation of the above symptoms of illness, the child/student must remain at home and cannot attend school. I am also aware of the legal consequences in the event of a false declaration, in particular that I am aware that I would be committing an offence under Section 21(1)(f) of Act No 372/1990 Coll. on offences.

¹ Close contact is considered to be a person who has had personal contact with a COVID-19 case within two metres for more than 15 minutes, or physical contact with a COVID-19 case, or unprotected direct contact with a COVID-19 case in an enclosed environment for more than 15 minutes, or the actions of a frontline worker (paramedics, firefighters, police, etc.) or other person providing care to a COVID-19 case without the use of the recommended personal protective equipment (PPE). A person who is not considered to be a close contact as defined by the currently applicable decree of the National Health Service (normally a fully vaccinated person or a person who has overcome COVID-19) is not considered to be a close contact.

² "First-line" workers (paramedics, firefighters, police officers, etc.) only comment on the symptoms of acute illness of their child/student and on the order for quarantine.

³ A person is considered to be fully vaccinated: **a)** at least 14 days but not more than 12 months after application of the second dose of COVID-19 vaccine in a two-dose series; **b)** at least 21 days but not more than 12 months after application of the first dose of COVID-19 vaccine with a one-dose series, or **c)** at least 14 days and not more than 12 months after the first dose of COVID-19 vaccine, if the first dose of COVID-19 vaccine was administered within 180 days of the onset of COVID-19 disease.
