English

We will continue with the Read Write Inc. programme to build children's phonics skills, helping them read and write with confidence. We will enjoy exploring the engaging story The Papaya That Spoke, using it to develop comprehension, vocabulary and discussion skills.



Maths

We will begin by exploring numbers to 1000, focusing on place value, odd and even numbers, and counting in 10s and 100s. Students will then use mental strategies to add and subtract two-digit numbers with confidence and accuracy.



Science

We will begin by learning about materials and the states of matter. Students will investigate the properties of solids, liquids and gases, then explore mixtures and discover how different materials can be separated using simple methods.



Topic

In Topic, we will explore the fascinating Roman Empire, discovering how people lived and the impact it had on history. Students will learn about Roman legends, gods and goddesses, and other exciting aspects of Roman life.



Slovak

In year 3, the main objective in writing is to acquire the fundamental principles of the language system. Students become familiar with basic grammatical and linguistic rules. They make significant progress in reading and writing and in reading comprehension.



PE

Students will advance their spatial awareness and balance, lead warm-ups and body-safety routines, and refine movement mechanics by combining leaping and bounding with controlled catching and precision throwing in motion.



Art

Students will continue to explore and experiment with the Visual Elements of Art, taking inspiration from the shapes, patterns, textures and colours found in nature. They will experiment with mark-making techniques and make creative choices with increasing confidence.



Music

We will explore melody, pitch, and solfège while developing singing and performance skills. Students will discover how music can tell stories through words, sounds, movement, and expression, and begin creating and performing their own simple melodies.



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
