Introduction

This Handbook provides an overview of our assessment philosophy and practice at Cambridge International School. We are an international school offering Cambridge qualifications, namely IGCSEs and A-Levels. In addition, we are also licensed by the Slovak government, which enables our students to graduate with a Maturita, the Slovak secondary school leaving certificate. This unique set of circumstances influences our assessment practice as we are bound by local requirements in terms of grading and grade boundaries.

Assessment

Assessment instruments may include tests, examinations, extended practical work, projects, portfolios and oral work, some carried out over a prolonged period. Teachers have their own assessment styles linked to the demands of their subject and will award grades based on Cambridge grade boundaries rather than the Slovak Ministry boundaries. the As a school, we believe that assessment is a key part of the learning process as it allows students and teachers to identify areas for development. At CIS, we are less concerned with grades than we are with students developing the skills and knowledge they will need to succeed in their official examinations.

Grading

As an international school that is bound by Slovak law we must grade and report to parents using the Slovak system. Grades are given 1 to 5:

- 1 Excellent
- 2 Very Good
- 3 Good/Satisfactory
- 4 Pass
- 5 Unsatisfactory/Fail

According to the laws of the Slovak Ministry, we have been asked to grade tests on the following grade boundaries:

Grade	Percentage
1	85% +
2	84% - 75%
3	74% - 65%
4	64% - 55%
5	54% - 0%

When students move into Year 10 and above, they are working towards being assessed in external exams delivered by the Cambridge International Examinations board in the UK. Consequently, we are required to review and adjust our grade boundaries to fit with these requirements. Please note that grade boundaries often change both annually and between separate subjects. Students taking AS and A-Levels will not be graded using the Slovak Ministry boundaries.



Recording

As a minimum, every subject teacher will record at least one IZK grade per student per month. Various assessments styles can be used, including but not limited to:

- End of unit test
- Presentation
- Quiz
- Essay
- Speaking test in languages
- Any other subject relevant assessment styles

In many cases, students will be assessed using past paper questions to prepare them for exams.

Art

There are three assessed components in the A-Level Art and Design course:

AS:

- Coursework (externally assessed) 50% of the AS course
- Externally Set Assignment (externally assessed) 50% of the AS course

A-Level:

• Personal Investigation (externally assessed) 50% of the A-Level

There are four Assessment Objectives for the AS and A-Level Art and Design course

- AO1 Record
 Record ideas, observations and insights relevant to intentions as work progresses
- AO2 Explore
 Explore and select appropriate resources, media, materials, techniques and processes
- AO3 Develop
 Develop ideas through investigation, demonstrating critical understanding
- AO4 Present Present a personal and coherent response that realises intentions and demonstrates an understanding of visual language

Each of the Assessment Objectives has equal weighting (25%)

During the course the students are expected to, and will be assessed loosely on the following:

- Develop an inquisitive, creative approach to research and problem-solving
- Develop the ability to record from first-hand observation, personal experience and other sources



- Effectively communicate their personal response by improving technical skills in a range of processes and media
- Develop independent expression by analyzing, evaluating and applying concepts and techniques
- Articulate ideas and responses to their work and the work of others using a relevant vocabulary
- Develop a clear contextual framework that aids critical reflection of their work
- Develop a critical understanding of important concepts and formal elements of art and design
- Develop the skills needed to study art and design at higher education

Types of assessments: Tests, homework, class participation

Frequency:

1st half year (approximately) - 5 formal written tests at the end of each chapter, homework assessments, and 1 grade for class participation

2nd half year: (approximately) - 2 formal written tests at the end of each chapter (weight 0.1), mock exam grade with a triple weight, homework assessments, and 1 grade for class participation

1st half year: (approximately) - approximately 6 formal written tests at the end of each chapter, homework assessments, graded practical works, and 1 grade for class participation

2nd half year: (approximately) - approximately 4 formal written tests at the end of each chapter, mock exam grade with a triple weight, homework assessments, graded practical works, and 1 grade for class participation

Frequency:

1st half year: (approximately) - 7 formal written tests at the end of each chapter, 1 or 2 homework assessments per week, and 1 grade for class participation

2nd half year: (approximately) - 5 formal written tests at the end of each chapter, mock exam grade with a triple weight, 1 or 2 homework assessments per week, 2 graded programming tasks, and 1 grade for class participation

This will include analysis of a variety of fiction and non/fiction text and a series of writing tasks based upon descriptive and narrative writing and writing for a purpose and audience

<u>Types of assessments:</u> Tests and past paper questions (essays and data response questions)

Frequency:

1st half year: (approximately) - 2 formal written tests and several past paper questions. Past paper questions may be completed in class or for homework. The weighting for work completed at home will be lower than for work completed in class under supervision.

2nd half year: (approximately): Past paper questions (essays and data response questions) on a regular basis and the mock exam. Past paper questions may be completed in class or for homework.

Weightings: Tests - 60% and Past paper questions - 40%

<u>Types of assessment:</u> Students will receive several assessments, including tests, past papers, essays, and short presentations and projects followed by discussion about specific topics.

Frequency:

1st half year: (approximately) - 6 formal written tests at the end of each chapter, 8-10 written assessments (essays), homework assessments (past papers), 3-5 graded speaking assessments, and 3 grades for class participation

2nd half year: (approximately) - 4 formal written tests at the end of each chapter, mock exam grade with a triple weight, 6-8 written assessments (essays),homework assessments (past papers), 3 graded speaking assessments, and 1 grade for class participation

Frequency:

1st half year: Grades will be calculated using an average score from all completed end of unit tests and an attitude to learning mark.

2nd half year: Grades will be calculated using an average score from all end of unit tests, all completed past papers, an attitude to learning mark plus the mock examination for Pure 1 (Year 12), Pure 2/3 (Year 13).

End of unit testing frequency: once per month

Weighting:

- all formal tests (weight x 1)
- all past papers (weight x 1)
- mock exam written (weight x 3)
- attitude to learning mark (weight x 1)

 2^{nd} half year: (approximately) – 4 formal written tests at the end of each chapter, mock exam grade with a triple weight, homework assessments, 5x graded practical works or planning/data analysis questions

2nd half year: (approximately) - 4 formal written tests at the end of each chapter, 1 mock exam with a triple weight, 4 grades for class participation (1 every month), and 2 grades for homework
