

Primary School Homework Policy 2024/25

Homework plays a crucial role in extending the knowledge, understanding and skills developed in school and provides opportunities for students to consolidate, enrich and extend their learning. As part of the learning process, students should be encouraged to take risks and test ideas in their homework while developing their independent study and research skills.

Teachers set a variety of homework, and your child may be expected to access various online and physical resources to complete it.

Your child will always be provided with instructions for accessing any online resources and will be provided with any other resources by their class teacher.

When teachers set homework, they will provide expectations and guidance for completing this work.

In terms of frequency and type of homework, the table below provides a guide to the homework each subject area will set and the resources your child will be expected to use/access to complete this.

Students and parents will be notified of the weekly homework via Seesaw and informed that homework has been set via the class teacher or subject specialist. We strongly encourage parents to remain actively involved in their child's education and support them in effectively planning their time outside of school to meet their homework deadlines.
