Dress Guidance

We adopt a very flexible approach when it comes to dress code at CIS and aim that our students adopt a smart-casual approach to school. However, we are working in a learning environment which does place some restrictions on what students can wear, particularly with regard to their health and safety in Science and PE.

Students will leave CIS to attend university or to go out into the workplace. In both these situations, they are likely to have to adhere to a dress code and we believe it is important to get into good habits now.

The guidance we provide makes no judgement about the clothes that students wear and is designed only to stipulate what is appropriate or inappropriate for a professional work environment.

In addition to this, we expect students to wear clothing that is appropriate for the seasonal nature of weather in Slovakia.

We hope that the guidance below will help to support students and parents. There is also a visual below the table that applies to girls and boys attending CIS in both the Lower and Upper Secondary sections of the school.
