

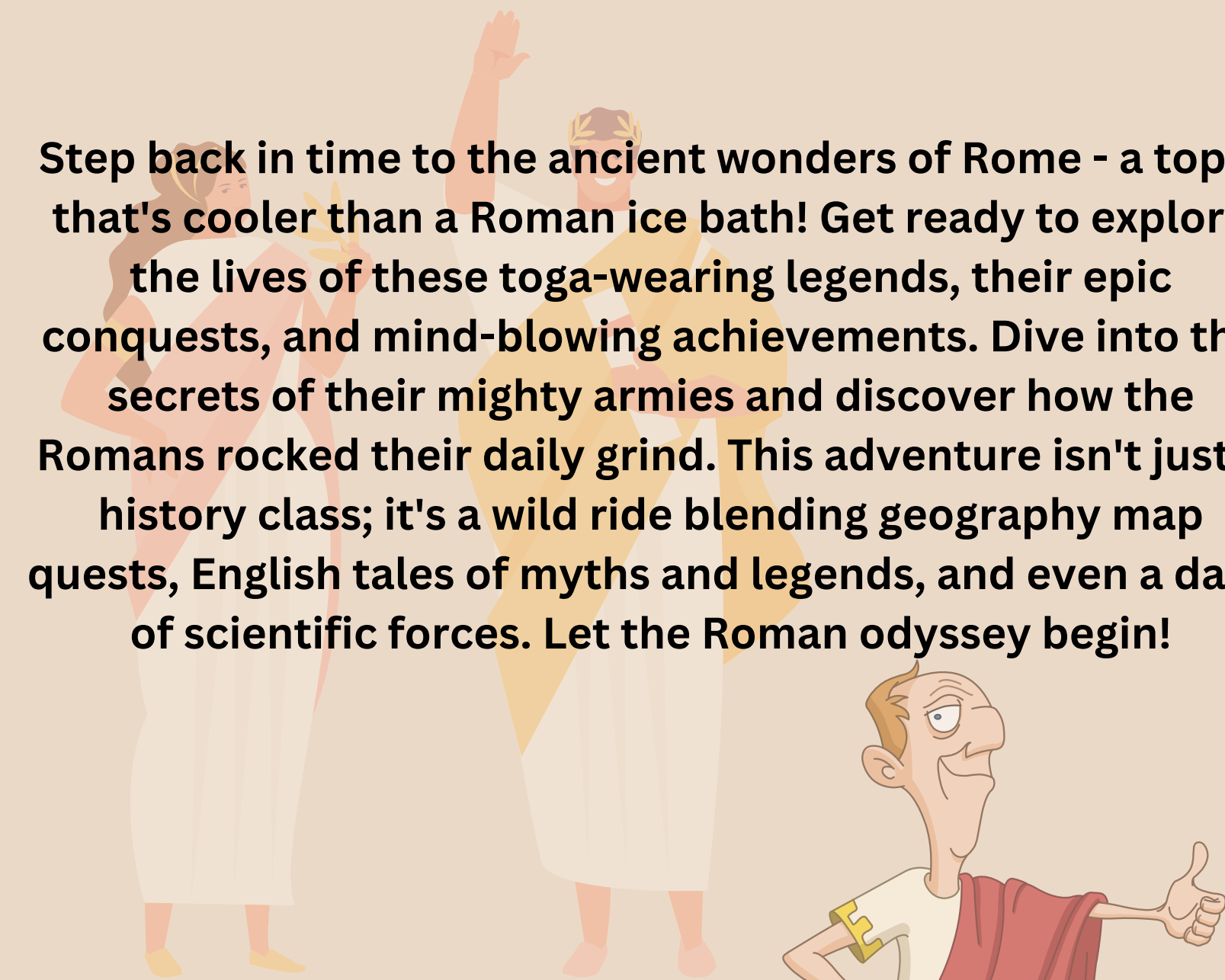

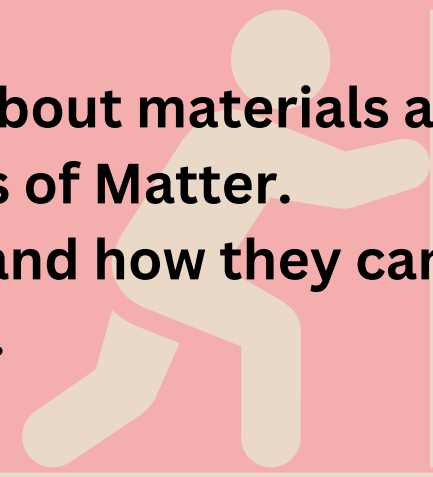
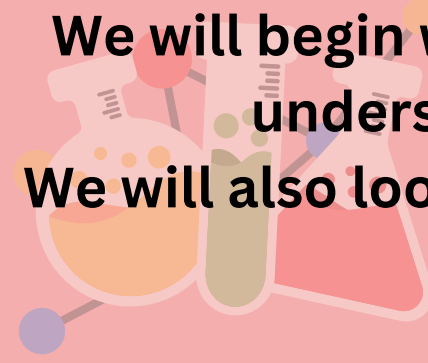
PSHE

In PSHE this term we will be focusing on making friends, recognising common interests, and respecting others and ourselves.



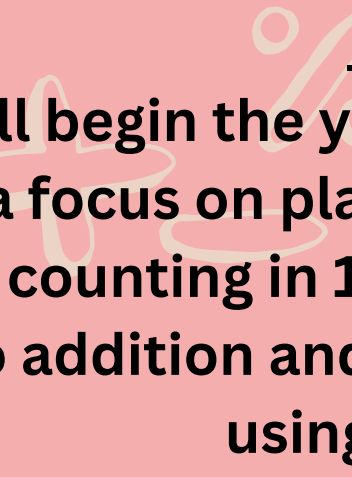
Science

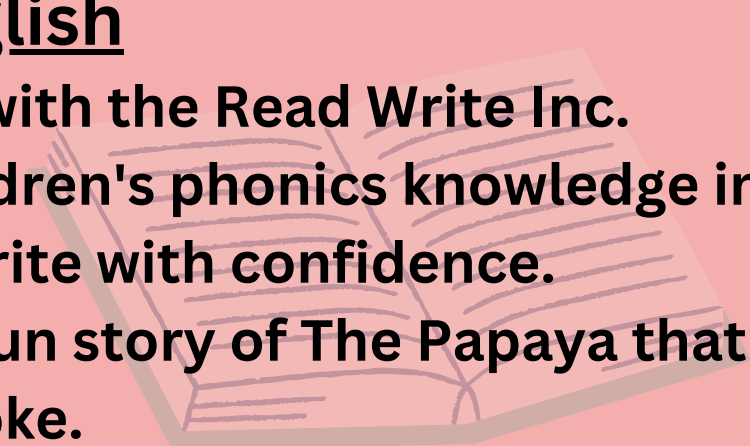
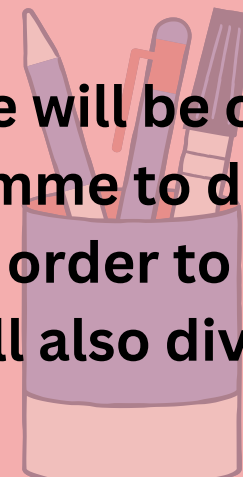
Art

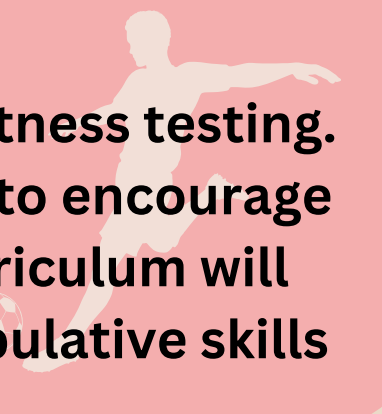
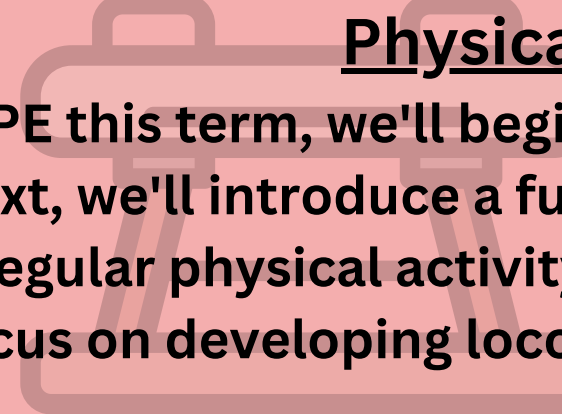
Forest School
